# BERMUDA

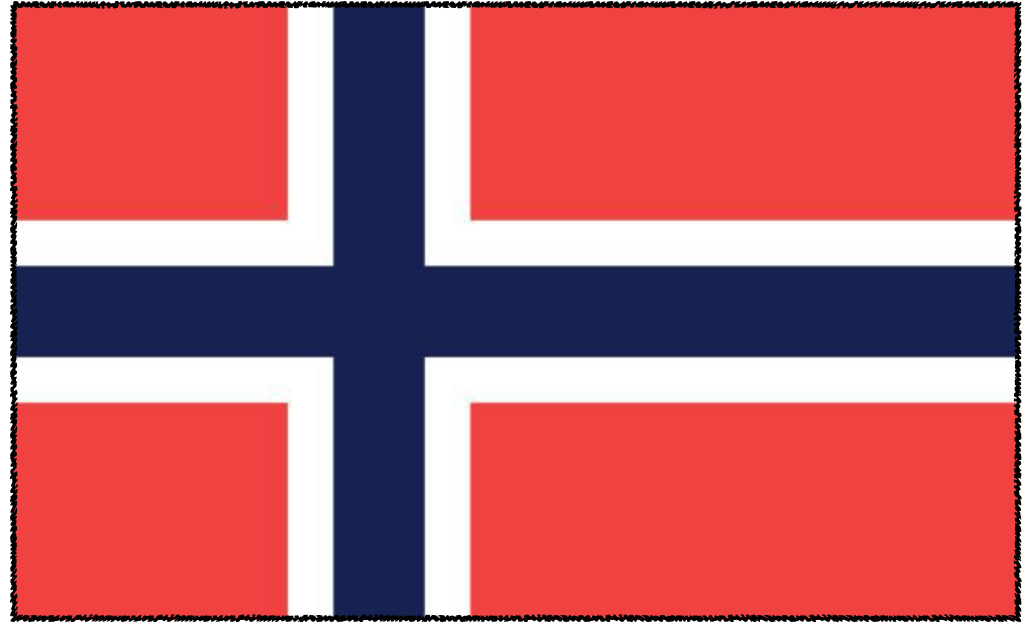
Many Bermudians enjoy codfish cakes inside a hot cross bun at Easter. On Good Friday, home-made kites are flown on the beaches. It is thought that this is because a teacher was trying to explain Jesus' ascension to heaven and used a kite to demonstrate. On Easter Sunday, many people attend sunrise services, held outside at dawn.





# NORWAY

In Norway, the shops close on the Wednesday before Easter and it is the last day of work. Lots of people use the long Easter break to take a trip to the mountains. Skiing competitions are often organised for Easter Saturday. Norwegians enjoy crime and detective stories, and reading them at Easter is a popular tradition.



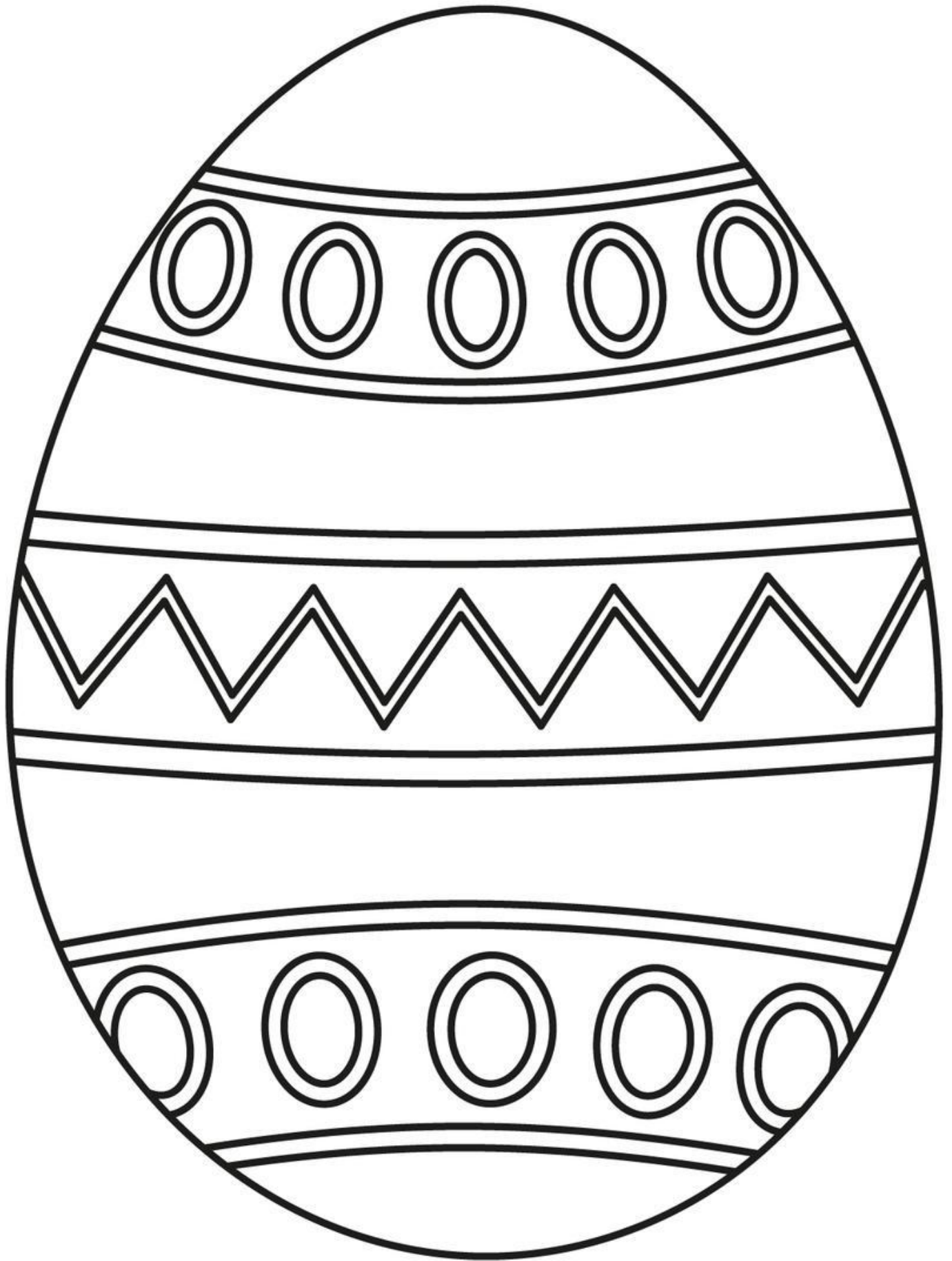
# GERMANY
