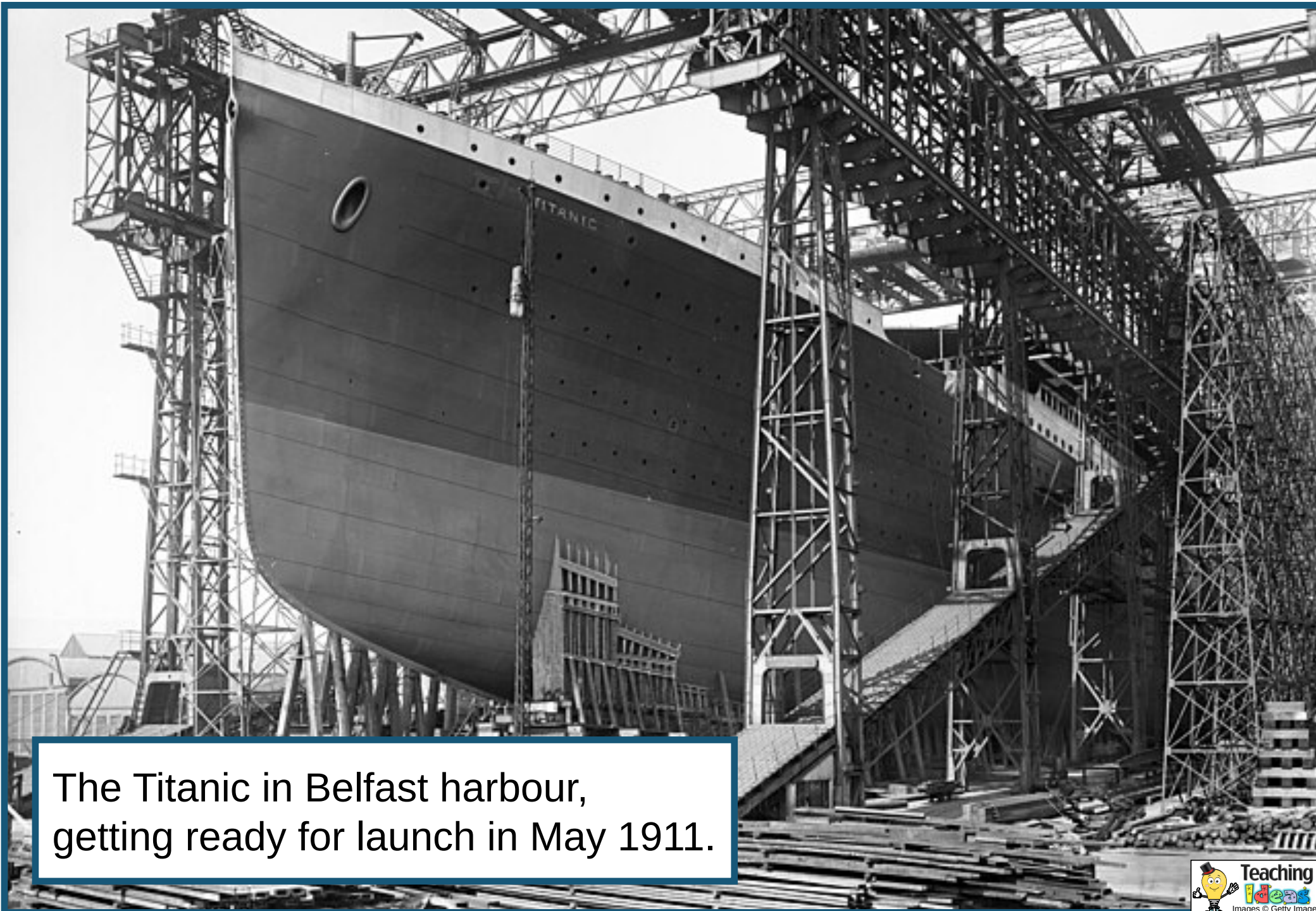
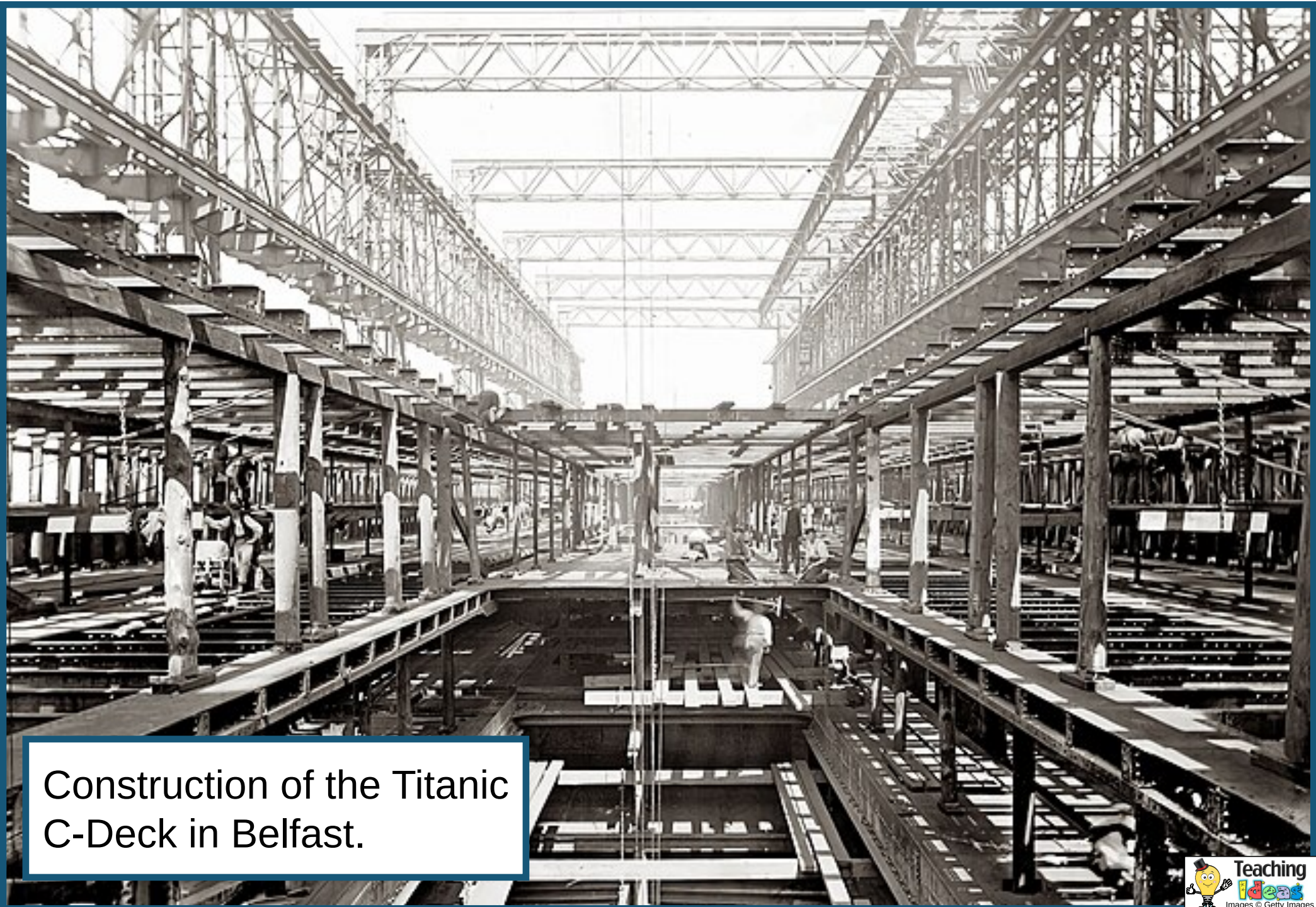




The Titanic in Belfast harbour,
getting ready for launch in May 1911.

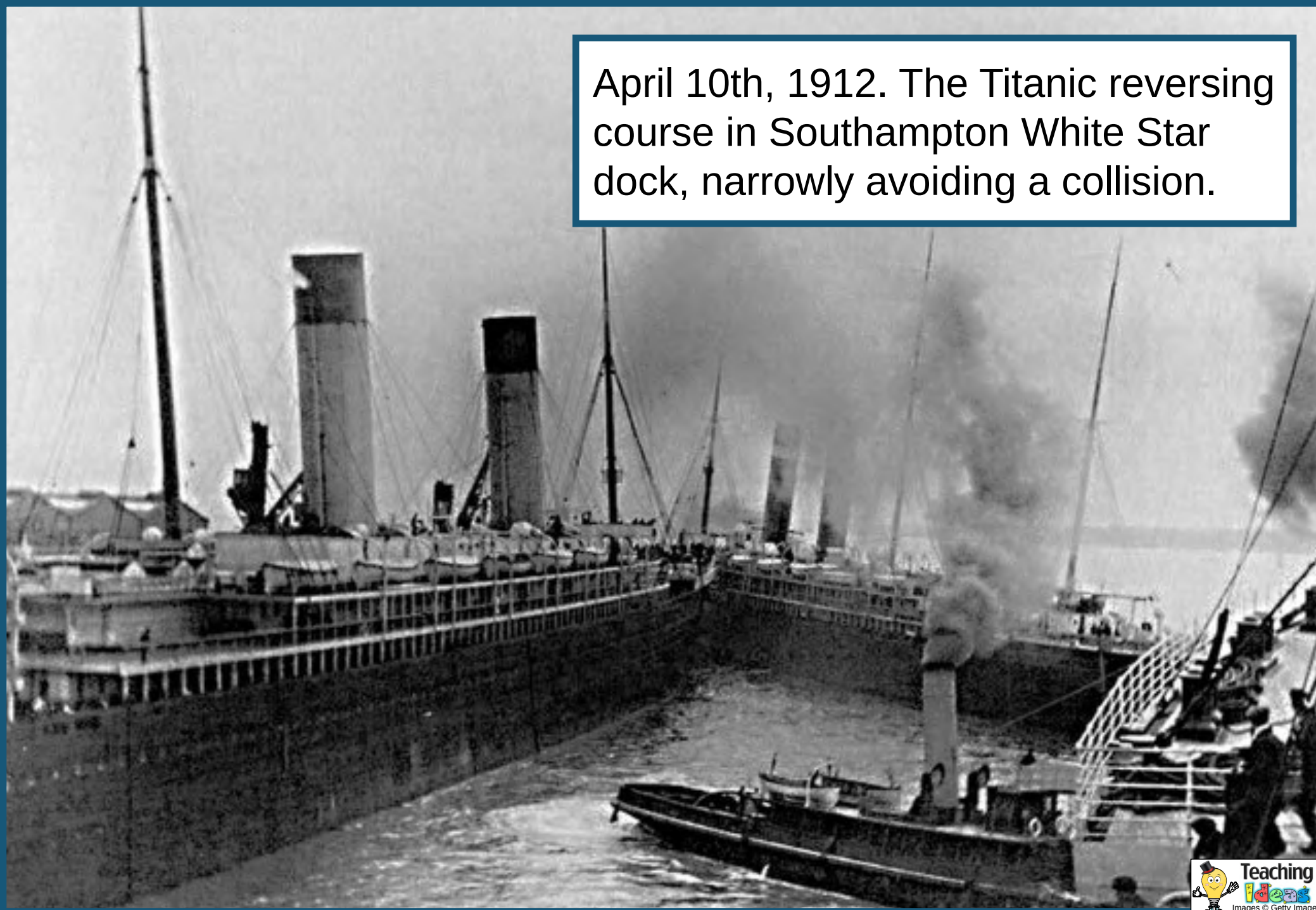


Construction of the Titanic

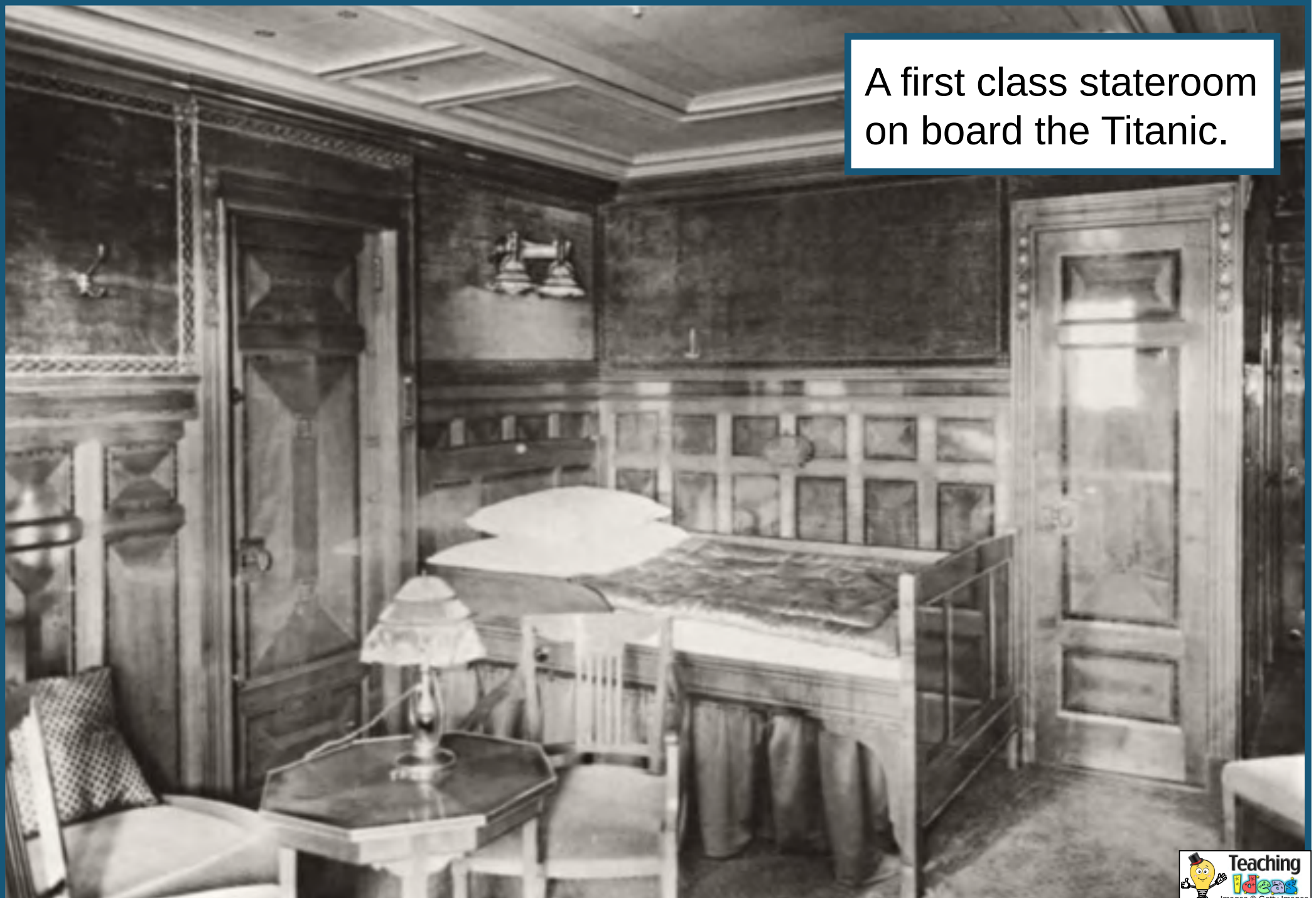

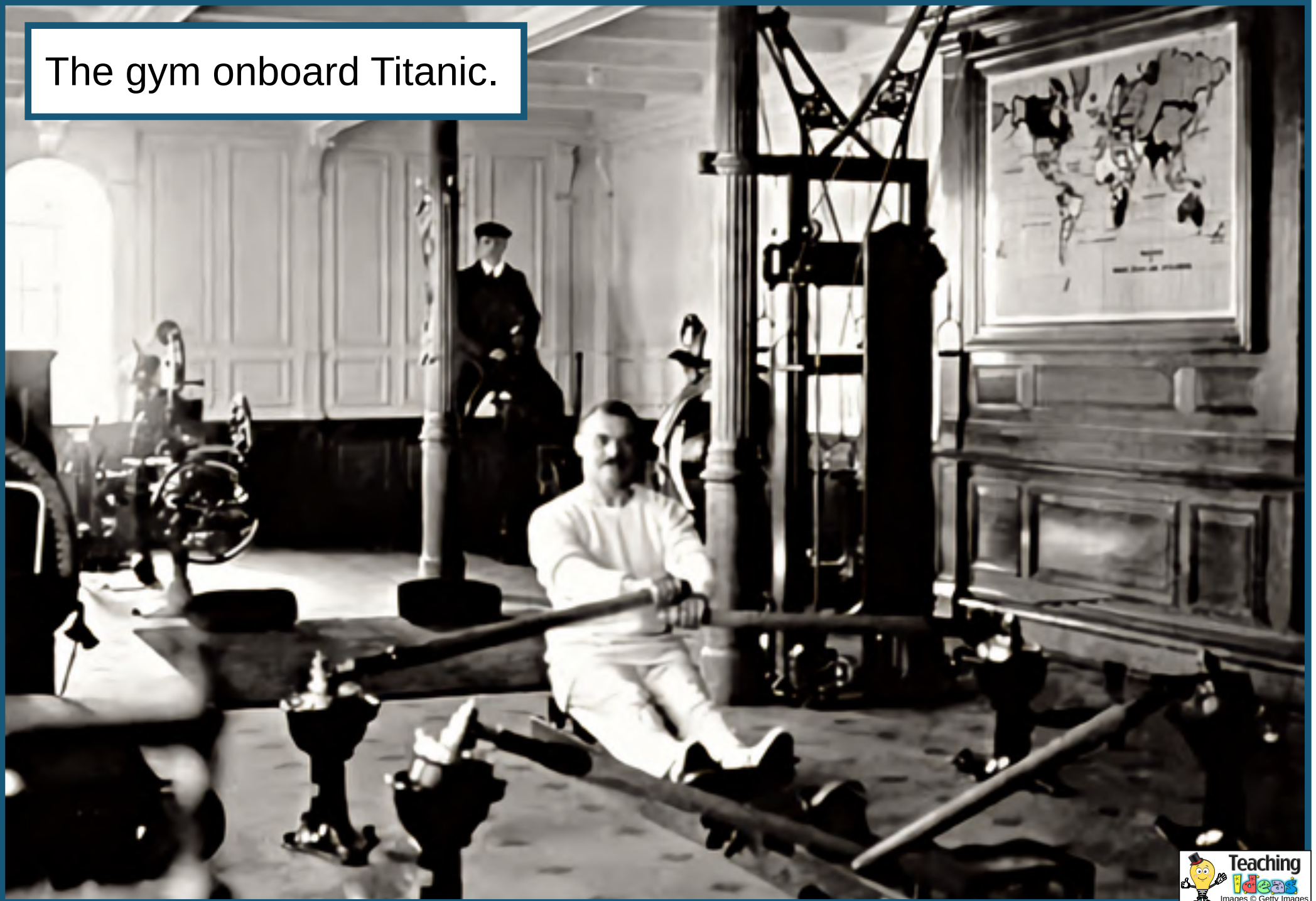

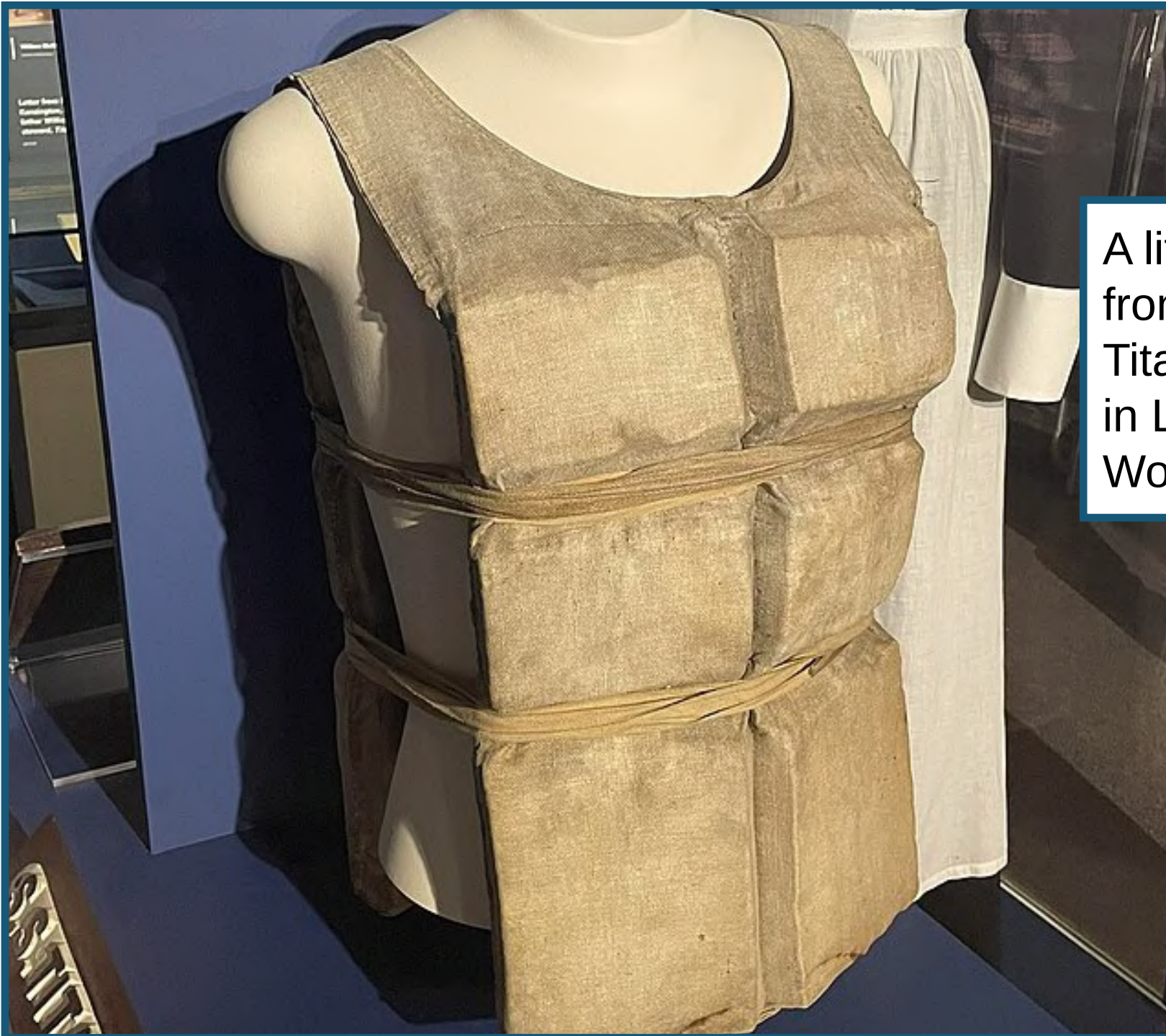
