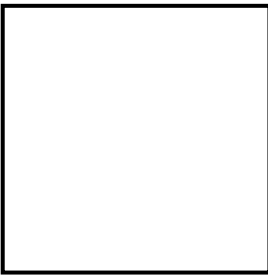


Creative writing with 3 sounds

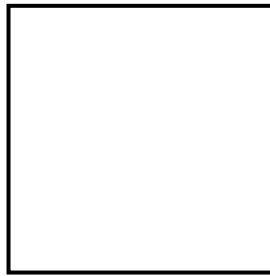
This is a great way to introduce students to sound and the imaginative ideas it can open up.

The sound file consists of 3 soundscapes - for each one the children draw or write words describing ***what they think the sound represents***. It is important that this is emphasised - it is not guess the sound - it is what the sound represents to them. The children can work in pairs or on their own - whatever works best.

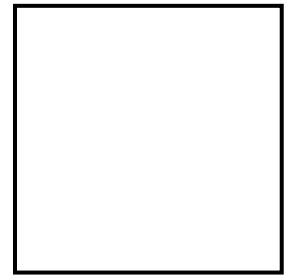
Sound 1

Each box will then contain ideas. Try the following with these ideas -

1. Write a haiku poem with each line representing one of the boxes - you can rearrange the boxes to suit your needs or have them in the order of the sounds.
2. Try and create a mini story of just 6 words linking the sounds
3. Try creating a longer story with the sounds representing different points in the story
4. Think of words that describe the sounds - use a thesaurus to expand your sonic vocabulary
5. For younger children have discussions about what may be happening for each sound - what can they see when they listen to the sounds. Discuss visualisation and how this can be a powerful and effective way to gather ideas.
